1. Which levels of government can most affect the health of your lake?
2. Can you vote for or against members of this government?
3. Should you?
4. Do you care enough to vote?
5. Can you vote from home?
6. Are you on the voting list?
7. How do I find out about the candidates?

Answers

1. Many say that your local municipal government can have the greatest impact on the health of your lake – certainly more than the federal government
 - a. Yet the turnout of voters is lowest in local elections where your vote matters the most
2. If you are a property owner (or spouse of owner) of a municipal property – seasonal or year round – **You Can Vote** in local elections in Haliburton County
3. Should you – *you are kidding right* – **of course you should vote** - if you care about your lake, your property values your taxes and more
4. Do you care – we will watch the turnout to see
5. All 4 municipalities make it easy for you to vote from your permanent home – by mail in ballots or electronically.
6. Are you on the voter list – go to www.voterlookup.ca to check
7. We ask that you vote for candidates that have shown that they care about our lakes – your lakes – read their platforms, look at their records in government and in volunteering.
